Are you at risk of losing your unemployment benefits?

With the new reform (Arizona), your unemployment benefits may be terminated. However, depending on your situation, you may be eligible for other benefits:

1. Are you sick or in poor health?

You may be eligible for benefits from **your mutual insurance company**.

✓ What should you do?

- Go to your doctor.
- Ask them for a certificate of incapacity for work.
- Give it to **your health insurance provider** (Solidaris, CM, etc.).
- The medical advisor will contact you.
- Contact **your health insurance provider** immediately.

3 2. Do you have a recognized disability or significant difficulties working?

You may be entitled to a disability allowance.

✓ What to do?

- Contact the General Directorate for Persons with Disabilities (GDPD).
- Submit an application via www.myhandicap.belgium.be.
- A doctor will assess your situation.
- Ask your local authority, health insurance fund, or CPAS for help with the application.

3. Are you 65 or older?

You may be eligible for a **pension** or a **supplement called GRAPA** (if you have a low income).

✓ What to do?

Contact the **Federal Pension Service** via www.sfpd.fgov.be Or call 1765 (free of charge).

4. Do you have no income and cannot rely on family support?

The CPAS can help you as a last resort with **Social Integration Income (RII)**.

✓ What to do?

- Go to the CPAS in your municipality.
 Bring your documents (ID card, proof of income).
- The CPAS is there if you are unable to claim any other benefits.

Don't wait until you lose your unemployment benefits. Take action now. Talk to a doctor, health insurance provider, union, or social worker. They can help you claim your rights.
